This charity has been a bellwether credit to our reputation in many ways.

# WCW MEMBERS COMPETE IN JUNE N50 BENCHREST MATCH IN TACOMA

WCW Range members Mark Huber and Keith Wilson competed in the N50 Benchrest Match held on Sunday June 16th at the Tacoma Rifle and Revolver Club. N50 is a National Organization that offers an opportunity for both Air Rifles and 22LR Rimfire Rifles to compete side by side in 4 Classes: Pro - Slug / Rimfire, Sportsman – Slug / Rimfire, Pellet, and Factory Rimfire.

It was a little chilly for a Match in June with the temperatures in the 50's. The day started off partly sunny but by the time the second Relay started it was completely sunny which really helped take the nip out of the air. The wind speeds weren't bad in either Relay as they varied from almost still with the wind flags hardly moving up to a max of 5 mph. However, the gusts were highly sporadic and variable and changed at the drop of a hat, so the random flyers were way too common which impacted scores and X count.

The Match consisted of two Relays. Each Relay shoots three targets with each target having a max possible score of 250 points. As this was Father's Day the turn out for the Match was lighter than normal with only 10 Competitors in June.

#### Pro Class:

In the first Relay Mark Huber took 1st place and kept his perfect streak from the May Match intact as he shot a perfect score of 250 on each of the three targets for a total score of 750 – 45X. With his first Relay performance Mark has the potential to finish in the top spot nationally in the N50 Pro class at the end of June.

In the second Relay Mark took 1st place again but saw his perfect streak end on his second target when he dropped a single point. Mark finished the second Relay shooting a total score of 749 – 34X. for 1st place.

#### Sportsman Class:

In the first Relay, Keith Wilson shot a very good three target total score of 748 – 37X for 1st place. Keith currently sits in 6th place nationally in the N50 rankings but has a chance to move up into 5th place nationally at the end of June.

In the second Relay, Keith took 1st place again shooting a very solid total score of 745 – 41X.

#### Handgun Report:

The following content was provided by Dave Rusko and was shared ahead of the board meeting.

 Off paper and cross bay shooting is still occurring on the Pistol range resulting in damage to protective wood covering of steel Ibeams.

- a. Limiters installed on paracord on shooting lanes 5-28 to prevent placing targets too close to the baffle support posts risking damage to I-Beam support columns.
- b. Rangemasters increasing firing line supervision of shooters to ensure all shots are aimed and hit paper. Still a challenging task on days with heavy shooter presence.

## Rifle/Pistol Special Use classroom report.

1. 6 members obtained Pistol Special Use in March 2024.

**New Member Orientation report** 

- 1. We had 27 new members attend the May 14, 2024 NMO.
- 2. We had 17 new members attend the May 19, 2024 NMO.
- 3. June 2024 NMO scheduled 11-June and 16-June

#### Maintenance:

- First round of electronics recycling was completed on 8-May 2024. Approximately 600lbs of old, used, inoperative electronic devices were recycled at no cost to the range.
- Range 4 buildout tree removal completed.
- Range 4 buildout grading in progress.
- Range 4 buildout grading drainage and washout mitigation in progress.
- Range I target frame cross boards ordered and received. Few cleats at 50 yards need shims to provide proper width accommodation for cross boards (previously repaired with wrong clearance measurements)
- Range 3 ceasefire bell converted to continuous tone to differentiation between cease fires on Range 3 and nearby Range 2. (Both ranges use same bell and interrupt which made it difficult to determine which range was under ceasefire when off range)
- Support header over East door of Shotgun clubhouse scheduled for replacement next 30 days. Materials on hand. Volunteer GC provides all work at no charge to the club. (One of Ops Managers tasks from his list of needed work outside the capability of the staff)
- New spotting scopes installed at Pistol Range on lanes 21-28. Lanes 17-28 now have new spotting scopes.

Training and Education:

- Martin Morehouse has worked with Legal Heat representative, and they are now current with their past due bill. Moving forward as agreed, they will pay \$175 per month for the use of the facility to provide one 4-hour session per month for an unlimited number of attendees.
- All NRA classes will require full payment when registering. Cancel/reschedule/no-show policy has been changed and effective 01-June 2024 there will be no refunds for missed classes. We will offer one reschedule at no charge to accommodate missed classes. There will be no other exceptions.
- All NRA class pricing has been increased effective June 1, 2024 per direction of Training and Education Committee Chair and are as follows:

NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading - \$129 for public, \$99 for Members

NRA Instructor Training - \$299 for non-Members, \$99 for Members (reimbursable if new instructor teaches 3 classes at WCW)

Attendees who registered and paid prior to 01-June for future classes receive the old price. New Business:

#### Membership:

- 1. When a family membership is purchased, all badges are printed with no requirement of the adult members other than the primary taking New Member Orientation. This presents a risk of members supervising their dependents with neither the member nor the dependent ever having received safety training.
- a. Proposal: All members should be required to take New Member Orientation.
- 2. When a dependent reaches legal age but is a post-graduate student (unconfirmed), they are still classified as dependent (per current policy) and are able to shoot under the family membership plan. This is an entitlement that is not fair to dependents of other family memberships still living at home that are not afforded the opportunity to attend college.

- a. Proposal: Require all dependents to obtain their own individual membership at the point they reach 21 years of age regardless of their postgraduate status (unconfirmed).
- b. Proposal: Remove the post-graduate entitlement and modify the dependent age restriction to "All dependent children residing in the home with the primary and/or spouse/partner"
- 3. Family memberships are currently defined as the primary member and spouse/partner and all minor children of the primary member still living in the primary member's residence. This is not equitable to societies changing family dynamics.
- a. Proposal: Expand the family definition to include grandchildren. "all minor children/grandchildren of the primary member still living in the primary member's residence" Clubhouse usage:
- 1. There are no posted use hours for the clubhouse. Some members believe that it is used only for scheduled events. Other members use the clubhouse during public and special use hours. There is no sign-in sheet for the clubhouse.

## Proposal:

- a. Define and publish clubhouse use hours and activities.
- b. Add a sign-in sheet.

The following content was provided by Martin Morehouse and was shared ahead of the board meeting.

# Shotgun Report:

The following content was provided by Rich Wasserman and was shared ahead of the board meeting.

The Spring non-registered Trap and Continental League is entering it's 4th week. About 25 shooters are participating in at least one event. Big thanks to the Shotgun staff for taking up the extra task of scoring members all trying to land a 25 for the week.

Five members participated in the first shotgun vision skills workshop taught by The Mind's Eye vision therapy group. Each received an individualized assessment of dynamic vision skills and the workshop consisted of various home exercises. The participants shared feedback on what worked and some areas to improvement. Prior to the class we hosted all the vision therapists on the Trap range for an afternoon. We received a lot of thanks and big smiles from the introduction. Hopefully they'll continue to refine and offer this class.

The monthly Multiplex was held early in May with Jim Storley taking home the buckle for High Over All in the event. If you've been curious about registered shooting this is a great way to dip your toe in ahead of the summer season. Feel free to reach out to Rich for more information or with questions.

The Phil Kiner classes are coming up on 6/7-6/9. Due to the classroom portion of the class expect some limitations on the use of the clubhouse those days.

We are starting to plan for the next summer shotgun picnic and fun shoot. We're targeting a Monday evening toward the end of July - but are working to nail down the great caterer again we had last year, so the exact timing may vary.

Trap Fundamentals continues to be sold out each month. At the last members meeting we discussed seeing if we can locate enough volunteer instructors to explore a 5-Stand fundamentals equivalent class.

#### Manager's Report:

Robert Haverstock presented.

Robert said he it is taking a lot of his time to work on contracts and working with people who would like to rent the range. Joe said this should not be part of Robert's job. Patty said she could start helping Robert with these.

Robert is getting ideas and bids on how to renovate the deck in front of the office.

22 LR competitions and other competitions on Range 1 - Robert says we should review how much money we are spending on these. He thinks we are losing money. Non-members come and are only charged \$10. Martin is not here today. Joe said we should let Martin work on this. He has a good way of dealing with things like this. Dave R. said it is on their agenda for the next rifle committee meeting.

#### Treasurer's Report:

They were finally able to reconcile the difference between QuickBooks and our accounts. We are doing good against the budget we approved.

Our bank accounts continue to do good. We asked for a 6 months extension on doing our taxes. We hired an accounting firm to help with our taxes.

The reason for the increase in our water bill was because of a running water source in a restroom. That has been fixed and we are monitoring it. Our interest income looked like it dropped because of a discrepancy between Morgan Stanley and QuickBooks. We made more interest than our records shows.

Dave L. thanked Joe M. for responding so quickly to address a letter from Washington State L&I.

#### **Trustees Report:**

John Sutton presented.

The trustees discussed who should be the 2-year trustee. They believe Scott should be the 2-year trustee. Dave Levinson moved to have Scott Ray be the 2-year trustee. Joe Maggiora seconded. Passed.

Dave L. believes we need a little more money than was approved by the board previously for the cover we want to build for the forklift. We do not have enough money with what we previously approved to build the shelter the trustees believe we need. We want to build a 24x24 shelter. We need about \$2500 more. Joe Maggiora moved we accept the proposal Dave Levinson presented. Scott Ray seconded. Passed.

Dave R. shared the proposal he sent to the board ahead of the meeting for the generator. Joe Rinaldi moved we approve a budget of \$1850 for the generator setup. John Sutton seconded. Passed.

The last swap meet was successful.

The trustees believe it is too dangerous for us to breakdown the large metal containers. We will need to find someone hired to remove them.

#### Old Business:

Martin collected all unpaid fees from Legal Heat. We now have a new agreement and contact with them. For future events, they will pay the club \$175 per month for four hours.

NRA training has doubled since June 1st.

Joe R. has been working with Bill Miele on the new bylaws. They have their last bylaws meeting this Friday. Joe will come up with some dates to review them with the rest of the board members. Joe encouraged the board members who want to participate in the review to attend.

For new members, is the opt-in working now?
Patty confirmed it is working correctly.
We discussed eliminating the initiation fee. We decided to wait until January to further discuss this topic. We will wait until January 2024 to look at the numbers and then revisit this topic.
Prior to the board meeting, Martin provided an update on the test website. He said we do not yet have something to review. The person helping with this is very busy at his real job and

has not had a chance to work on this.

We discussed paying to have videos created. Joe suggested Robert talk to Ray about creating a video. Robert will have Ray talk to Joe. Ahead of the board meeting, Martin said he is in favor of paying for videos, as long as we participate on the content.

We followed up on creating a RockGymPro report that will be shared monthly at each board meeting. Similar to our financial report. Dale sent out an email last month with a list of items that should be reported on. Some others added additional items to the list. Patty said she would be able to pull this report together for the July board meeting.

We briefly discussed the next steps on how we will be using the shotgun orientation lines information to reach back out to people. Joe R. will talk to Rich about doing this.

Dale met with Gabe and Gabi and provided Gabi our credentials for all our social media accounts. Ahead of the board meeting, Martin mentioned he has already seen several items from our calendar placed on Facebook.

Gabe and Aaron said they will be pausing the progress on the archery shelter until October 2024.

Gabe and Aaron have been working on updates to Range 4.

Robert and Dave R. said there was not an equitable solution to having a shredding event. Joe R. said we should really do this. We should target an event in August. Patty said she would investigate finding a company to have a shredding event at our club.

Patty provided an update on the viability of having a monthly payment program for members. She said we can do this. We need to define the process and make sure it complies with our bylaws.

Our 501c3 status was approved. Now we have to work on structuring our club accordingly.

## **New Business:**

Morgan Stanley would like to come to our next board meeting to share what they can do for us regarding our new 501c3 status.

New Family memberships historically has only required one parent taking the New Member Orientation. Dave R. believes the primary member and partner/spouse of a family

membership must attend the orientation. The board agrees.

Dave R. said there is no documented process on using the Clubhouse during non-reserved hours. The committee leads will get together to figure out the process and publish it.

Social media - Joe believes we need to push out information on social media like the comments from a customer that Martin just sent us. A new public visitor posted something very positive about our club. Joe said the committee leads need to be meeting monthly to discuss what we should be posting on social media. Dave L. asked if there was a way Gabi to send the board every time, she posts something. Gabe said he would talk to her about that.

#### For the Good of the Order:

Joe M. will be out for a while. Patty will be filling in for him.

Dave Levinson moved to adjourn at 9:16 PM. Joe Rinaldi seconded. Passed.
